


## Sun Smart Hats





# 7-9 COMMUNITY

## ENGLISH & HUMANITIES FOCUS

### Year 7 English

Last term the Year 7 English class completed a unit on poetry. They looked at a wide variety of poetic techniques used throughout literature, including onomatopoeia. The students also created their own 'Found' poetry. 'Found' poetry is a type of poetry that is created by taking words and phrases from other sources and rearranging them, taking out words and changing spaces, thus creating a new meaning in the text. Text can be altered in a creative way which can then visually represent the meaning of the poem. Here are a couple of examples from our Year 7s.



In Year 8 English we are studying the graphic novels "Coraline" by Neil Gaiman and "Frankenstein" originally by Mary Shelley, students have been reading these texts and completing activities about these texts in groups. Currently students are presenting their knowledge and understanding about the themes presented in these texts in poster form. Some students have made a really good start on their posters, with some really good elaborations on how the theme connects to certain character and where in the texts the theme is presented.

# Year 9 Novels

## Year 9 English

This term the Year 9 English class are reading a novel centred around World War 2 and the experiences of individuals during the Holocaust.

The students have been divided into small groups, and each group will be reading a different text. Within their groups, students will be able to engage in guided reading sessions where they discuss the text and the broader context of the Holocaust, whilst having the opportunity to work with Miss Dupuy in a smaller setting.

The texts the students will be reading are:

*Once by Morris Gleitzman*

*The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas by John Boyne*

*The Diary of a Young Girl by Anne Frank*

*Survivors Club: The true story of a very young prisoner of Auschwitz by Michael Bornstein and Debbie Bornstein Holinstat*

In **Year 7 and 8 Humanities**, we are currently looking at the topic of Place and Liveability. We are looking at what makes places more appealing to live than others. We have looked at the different objective factors for a places liveability which are: its climate, how safe and stable it is, its environmental quality, its infrastructure and its access to education and healthcare. Students are currently working in pairs to research aspects of a city that is one of the world's top 10 cities to live in to present as a poster to the class.

## STEP UP PROGRAM


Step up will occur for all students who will be in Year 11 & 12 in 2020.

## Year 12 Biology Excursion to the Gene Technology Access Centre (GTAC) in Parkville


On Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> September the Year 12 Biology students, together with Biology students from Wanganui Park Secondary College, attended an all-day practical workshop at GTAC in Melbourne. An early rising for a 6.30am departure from Rushworth, then off to Warring to meet up with the mini-bus from Wanganui to travel down to Melbourne.

At GTAC students attended an information session and hands on activities to outline and model the experimental procedures to be conducted in the laboratory. This was followed by the program in the Nossal Laboratory, where students were provided with an experience of DNA tools and techniques used for DNA manipulation in scientific research. Students worked in small groups, together with a science mentor (young practicing scientists), who guided them in the use of research grade biotechnology equipment throughout their investigations.

Everyone enjoyed a lunch break across the road at Melbourne University's student union; the vibrant campus community, craft market and glorious sunshine a great experience in itself. Afterwards, students returned to their laboratory to complete their activities. They collected and analysed results and prepared experimental material for further analysis, to be completed back at school as part of a scientific report on their investigations.

Arriving back home in Rushworth, tired but still animated at the end of a big day, everyone agreed that the program at GTAC had been a very worthwhile, interesting and enjoyable experience.




# INDONESIAN
